


## One of the few jurisdictions ......

Information is democratized


Ubiquitously available

#### **Options for college-university pathways**

- Homogenize the system
  - UK system failing
  - Re-introduce differentiation



- Create a transfer system
  - Expense re curriculum
  - Lacks flexibility



- Find a simple solutions
  - Focused on students and their needs

  - Some clear pathways
  - Trust between institutions
- Models include
  - Joint diploma degrees
  - A number of bilateral agreements
  - Exciting multilateral agreements
    - Engineering

    - Biotechnology




### **Opportunity for much more**



#### **Opportunities and options**

- On-going migration (evolution)
  - Joint diploma-degree programs
  - Specific transfer arrangements (bi-lateral)
  - Articulation agreements (multi-lateral)
- Changing the paradigm (revolution)
  - Bridging programs
  - On-line learning
  - Credit exchange "Bologna agreement"
  - Re-defining a degree learning outcomes
    - New concepts for joint diploma/degrees










## **Bologna Accord / Agreement**

- Credit transfer
- 47 countries
- Principles for agreement
  - Reduce the length of the European model for degrees
  - Open the possibility of mobility
- The challenges for Ontario
  - System based on credits or learning outcomes
  - Could it work here for training and education ?









## Re-think the paradigms

- New concept of a joint degree
  - Change the time-frame
    - Combination of on-line in the work place
    - And regular classes
  - Change the intensity
    - Use concepts of three year general degree
    - Fourth year could be either
      - Academically intensive
      - Vocational training















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
